

THE LAKATOID. The Lakatoid of Papua and New Guinea has a "crab claw sail" of plaited leaves or matting on a cane framework. The "ship" is made of two or three cances lashed together with fibre or split bamboo. The mast is stepped in a new cance and and an old one is used as the outrigger. The space between the canoes is decked over and cargo is carried on it.

THE SAMPAN. This small boat is to be found far up the rivers in the shallower waters of Malaya, Indo-China, China and Japan. It can be poled along or moves under sail and is often the home of the whole family as well as carrying the cargo. Some are built with overhanging sterns so that fishing nets can be easily hauled in.
