SAILING OUTRIGGER. The sailing outrigger often carries a sail much too large for it and the outrigger gives it stability. These canoes have no keels and are not suitable for rough waters as they have no grip on the water, but they can be very swift under suitable conditions. A surprising amount of cargo can be carried as the struts supporting the outrigger are often boarded over and used for this.

SOLOMON ISLANDERS CANOES.
These canoes were originally built with high prows to give the paddlers some slight protection against the arrows of their enemies. They are decorated with a figurehead to keep off evil spirits and the eyes of the figurehead are believed to be able to see and guide the boat past hidden rocks or enemies. The stern also is built high and they are paddled by 20 or more men.

THE LAKATOID. The Lakatoid of
Papua and New Guinea has a "crab
claw sail" of plaited leaves or matting on
a cane framework. The "ship" is made
of two or three canoes lashed together
with fibre or split bamboo. The mast is
stepped in a new canoe and an old one is
used as the outrigger. The space
between the canoes is decked over and
cargo is carried on it.

THE JUNK. The Junk is used all
over the China Seas, from the river boat
with one mast, which is usually the home
of the family, its stern overhanging the
water to facilitate dragging in the nets,
to the big sea-going Pirate, one of the
most sea-worthy vessels in the world.

bottomed, and have one, two or three
masts and matting sails stiffened with
battens.
